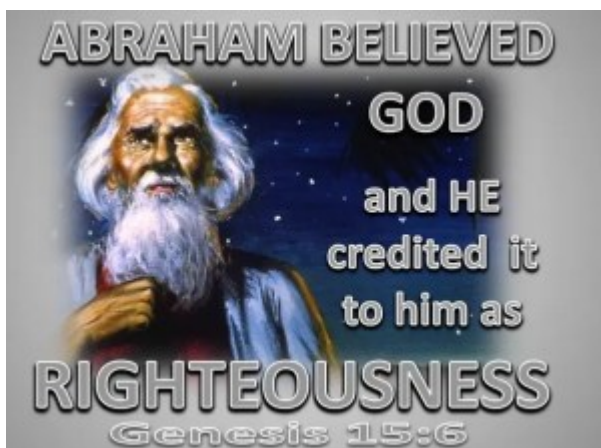

According to the Bible, which of the below is the Antichrist likely to look like?



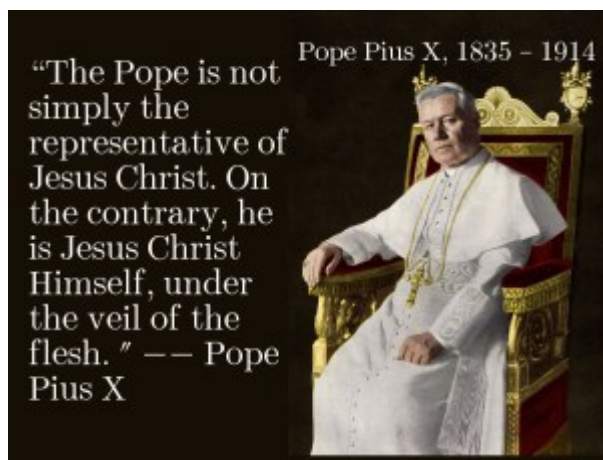

The Two Babylons Chapter IV. Section II – Justification by Works



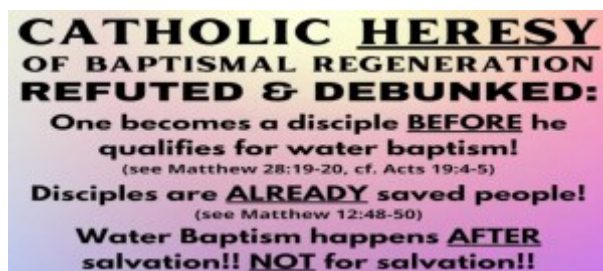

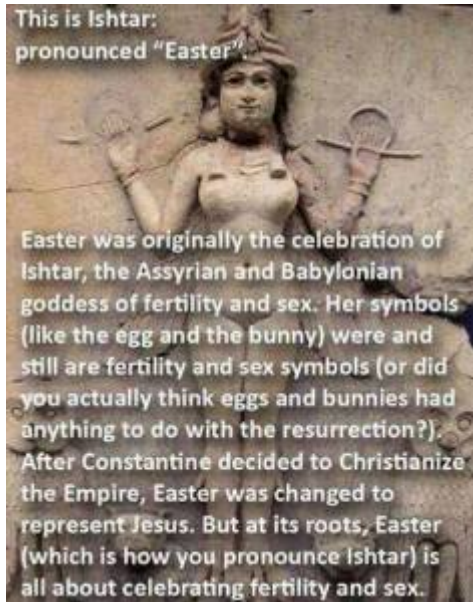
The carnal policy the Church of Rome at the expense of truth, and the circumstances attending the festival of the Assumption show yet more daring wickedness and blasphemy.

The Two Babylons Chapter III. Festivals. Section III – The Nativity of St. John



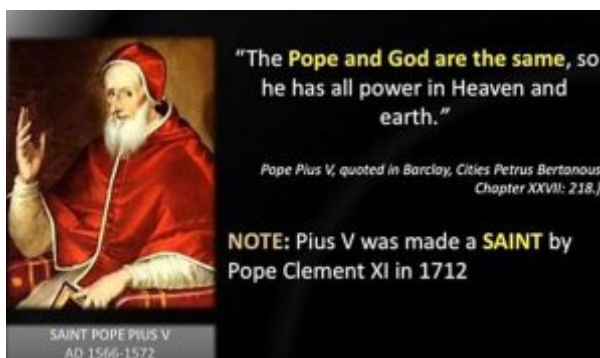

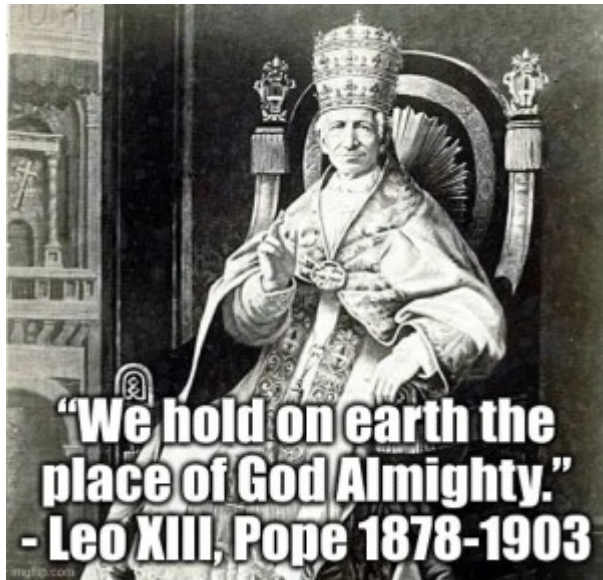
The time of the appearance of the Antichrist is definitely fixed by Daniel, by Paul, by John among the ten heathen horns of the Fourth Wild Beast.
